DABC provides workshops for educators, which aim to equip school staff with the knowledge and tools to recognize signs of dyslexia, understand its impact on learning, and implement effective strategies to support students with dyslexia. By fostering a deeper understanding of dyslexia and its intersection with culture and language, educators can create more inclusive and justice focused learning environments.

Educator Workshop: Understanding Dyslexia: A Hidden Reading Disability

In this workshop, participants will:

- Develop an understanding of reading acquisition and the brain.
- Identify the signs and symptoms of dyslexia, the neurological underpinnings and impact social emotional development.
- Differentiate between a clinical diagnosis of dyslexia and an IDEA classification.
- Understand evidence-based interventions for students with dyslexia and other reading difficulties
- Interrogate barriers to identification.

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Educator Workshop: Partnering with Families: Dyslexia Awareness and Support

In this workshop, participants will:

- Understand the signs and symptoms of dyslexia in students and the potential impact on families.
- Identify why families experience an outsized advocacy burden when navigating services.
- Explore the impact of intergenerational school trauma and multi-generational low literacy.
- Develop a plan to partner and support families through building toolkits and familycentered activities.

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Educator Workshops:

Supporting Students with Dyslexia during Out-of-School Time Activities

This workshop will explore how out-of-school time staff and volunteers can support students during homework help and reading activities.

- Understand the signs and symptoms of dyslexia and other learning and attention disorders.
- Understand the challenges students with dyslexia face during homework time.
- Identify strategies to support word reading, comprehension, and writing.
